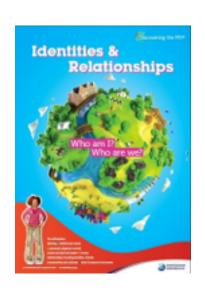


- 2. Recently, when I started to think of ideas, I thought of what my hobbies were and really wanted to do something about one of my hobbies. One of my hobbies were writing stories, so I started to think of ideas in which I can use this skill in helping others. However, I thought it was a weak project to teach kids how to write books, because I didn't know what my goal at the end was and how I am contributing to the community.
- 3. In the weekly CP sessions with my supervisor Ms. Dema, I thought of what I can do. Ms. Dema brought up this orphanage called: "مؤسسة الحسين الاجتماعية ", and I thought about having that orphanage as my target market, because I love interacting with little children, especially orphans. I feel as if all orphans can offer so much to the world, so I decided that I must unleash their talents, interests, and skills by helping

- them gain a bigger imagination. I also had another idea to do this: by helping them have more job opportunities in the future by teaching them english which is the common language in the world.
- 4. I was then baffled by which community project idea I should choose: Teach orphans creative writing, or teach orphans english. Later on I asked Ms. Dema to tell me more about this orphanage, and she told me that there are also illegitimate children who are the children who don't know who their parents are. From there, I was able to set my target market, but not completely. With the help of Ms. Dema, I came up with the community project that I wanted to do: Teach orphans and illegitimate children english and creative writing, and at the end I want to publish a short book for them and donate the money that was earned to them.

Global Context: Identities and Relationships

I chose this as the Global Context of my community project because I am helping orphans and illegitimate children explore and unleash their identity, skills, talents, values, and beliefs.
